TITLE: **MINIMUM TRAINING STANDARDS POLICY FOR RESERVE FIRE  
SUPPRESSION PERSONNEL**

All reserve fire suppression personnel will be required to attend department-approved training to maintain proficiency in their skills and insure safety. This policy addresses the MINIMUM training standard for reserves assigned to the Fire Suppression Division. The minimum required attendance to department-authorized training is 66 percent, in addition to all training mandated by law.

An organized training class will be conducted 22 times each year at each designated training site. Each course of instruction is repeated three times each month. Credit for attendance and participation at training can be accomplished at any designated training site.

In addition to the required 66 percent attendance at department training, the following mandated standards shall be maintained at all times:

1. CPR
2. 40-Hour First Responder
3. Sudden Infant Death Syndrome
4. Incident Command System - I 220
5. Hazardous Materials First Responder - Operational Level
- \* 6. *Hazardous Materials Incident Commander*

Department training will be coordinated and approved by the department Training Division. Other courses that may be approved by the Training Division may be:

1. Stanislaus County Fire Training Officers
2. Modesto Junior College—Fire Science Courses
3. State Fire Marshal Courses
4. California Specialized Training Institute
5. Federal Emergency Management Agency

Failure to meet the minimum standard will result in disciplinary action, leading to suspension, demotion or termination or any combination thereof.

Approved absences authorized by the Training Division will be recorded as attendance and not recorded as an absence. It will be the responsibility of the individual to make sure they are credited for training, calls for service, and/or excused absences.
