Procedure: Residential Fire Attack (SCFPD C-92)

Purpose: To identify the tactical assignments for the first alarm companies operating on the fire ground. The “tactical objectives” are those actions performed on the fire ground to support the identified Operating mode (offensive/defensive). This procedure shall apply to all Fire Department personnel.

A) Residential Offensive

- 1) Engine/Squad/Quint Tactical Objectives
 - a) Incident Command
 - b) Apparatus Placement
 - c) Primary Attack Line
 - d) Sustained Water Supply
 - e) Consideration for backup and/or additional hand lines
 - f) RIC and Utilities
 - g) Search

- 2) Truck/Squad/Quint/Rescue Tactical Objectives
 - a) Incident Command
 - b) Apparatus placement
 - c) Ventilation (Vertical, Horizontal, PPV)
 - d) Search (Primary, VES)
 - e) Forcible Entry
 - f) Ladders
 - g) RIC and Utilities

B) Residential Defensive

- 1) Engine/Squad/Quint Tactical Objectives
 - a) Incident Command
 - b) Apparatus placement
 - c) Placement of primary attack/exposure line

- d) Sustained water supply
 - e) Consideration of secondary water supply
 - f) Placement of additional attack line and/or exposure line
- 2) Truck/Squad/Quint/Rescue Tactical Objectives
- a) Incident Command
 - b) Apparatus Placement
 - c) Forcible Entry
 - d) Exposure and Extension
 - e) Utilities
 - f) Elevated master stream consideration
